

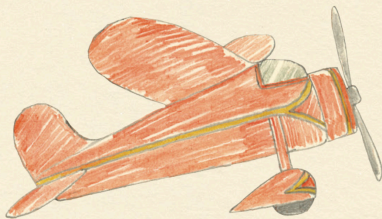


# REAL-WORLD PROBLEMS

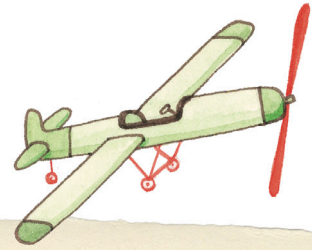
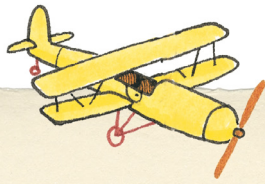
